

Bible Games, Crafts, & Activities

Use to reinforce the story and bottom line.

Bible Story Focus: I spy someone who tells the truth.

Bottom Line: I can believe in Jesus.

Bible Game - Night and Day

What you need: No supplies needed

What you do: Gather your kids to spread out in your activity area. When you say, “daytime,” encourage your kids to dance. Then, say, “night,” and encourage your kids to pretend to sleep. Flip back and forth between the two as children dance or sleep. Repeat as time and interest allow.

Discussion/Application: “That was SO fun! I saw some awesome dance moves. The sun comes out in the day, and the moon comes out at night. In our Bible story today, we heard how Paul told other people about Jesus. He talked about Jesus day and night because Paul wanted them to believe in Jesus! **Who can believe in Jesus? [Bottom Line] I can believe in Jesus!**”

Bible Activity - True Story

What you need: No supplies needed

What you do: Retell the Bible story using hand motions for key points. Encourage your kid(s) to do the hand motions with you: thumbs up, rock a baby, hug yourself, and sign “Jesus loves me.” (*How to sign “Jesus loves me”:* Touch middle finger of right hand to left palm then middle finger of left hand to right palm, hug yourself, then point to your chest.)

What you say: “Come sit with me! We are going to tell the Bible story together. Paul went to a city called Rome to tell them that they can believe what Jesus says, because He always tells the truth. (*Give two thumbs up.*)

“We can believe Jesus when He says He is God’s Son. Jesus is God’s Son. Say that with me while you pretend to rock baby Jesus, like this. (*Pretend to rock a baby.*) Jesus is God’s Son.

“We can believe Jesus when He says He loves us. Jesus loves me! Say that with your mouth while we say it with our hands like this. (*Sign ‘Jesus loves me.’*) Jesus loves me!

“We can believe Jesus when He says He wants to be our friend forever. Jesus wants to be my friend forever! Say that with me while we give ourselves a big hug like this. *(Give yourself a hug.)* Jesus wants to be my friend forever!”

Discussion/Application: “We can believe in Jesus, because He always tells the truth. *(Give two thumbs up.)* **Who can believe in Jesus? [Bottom Line] I can believe in Jesus.**” *(Repeat the words and motions to the Bible story review if time and interest allows.)*

Bible Story Craft - True or False

What you need: “[Game Cards](#)” Activity Page, crayons, and scissors

What you do: Copy “Game Cards” and allow your child to color the pictures. Help them to cut along the dotted lines. Lay the cards face down and allow them to pick a card. Read what it says and encourage your children to respond with a thumbs up for “true” or a thumbs down for “false.”

What you say: “We are going to play a game called ‘True or False.’ We will take turns drawing a card from this stack for me to read. If what I read is TRUE—it really happens—then I want you to say, ‘True,’ and give me two thumbs up like this. *(Demonstrate.)* If what I read is FALSE—it does not happen—then I want you to say, ‘False,’ and give me two thumbs down like this. *(Demonstrate.)* Let’s play!”

Discussion/Application: “Our Bible story, today, was about someone very special who ALWAYS tells the truth. *(Give two thumbs up.)* Who did Paul tell the Romans about? *(Pause.)* Jesus! Paul told them how they can believe in Jesus because Jesus always tells the truth. **Who can believe in Jesus? [Bottom Line] I can believe In Jesus!**”
